# **Important Information** to help you on the day

First Aid – St John's Ambulance is behind Pig Promenade, near the main food stalls and stage. St John's will be performing demonstrations on what to do in an emergency on your property. Listen out to the MC during the day for times.

Assistance and information – The Field Day office is situated next to the main stage. The committee volunteers and coordinator will be wearing Hi-Viz green shirts with the Field Day logo on the front.

**Announcements** – will be made throughout the day by the popular MC to let you know what is happening.

Any lost children or parents will be cared for at the Field Day Office.


